Migration is the movement of people from one place to another place.

Refugee

A person who has been forced to leave their home. For example, due to war, persecution, or a natural disaster.

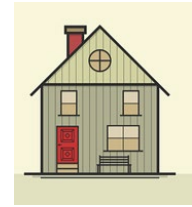
Types of Migration



National migration
Movement from one region to another, within the SAME country.



Forced migration
When the migrant has no choice in leaving their source country



Permanent migration
When the migrant intends on remaining in the host country



International migration
Movement from one country to another.



Voluntary migration
When the migrant makes a choice to leave their source country



Temporary migration
When the migrant intends on returning to their source country

Asylum seeker



Claim for asylum (protection) has not YET been accepted.

Refugee



Claim for asylum (protection) has been accepted.

Source Country

A country where a person is originally from.

Host Country

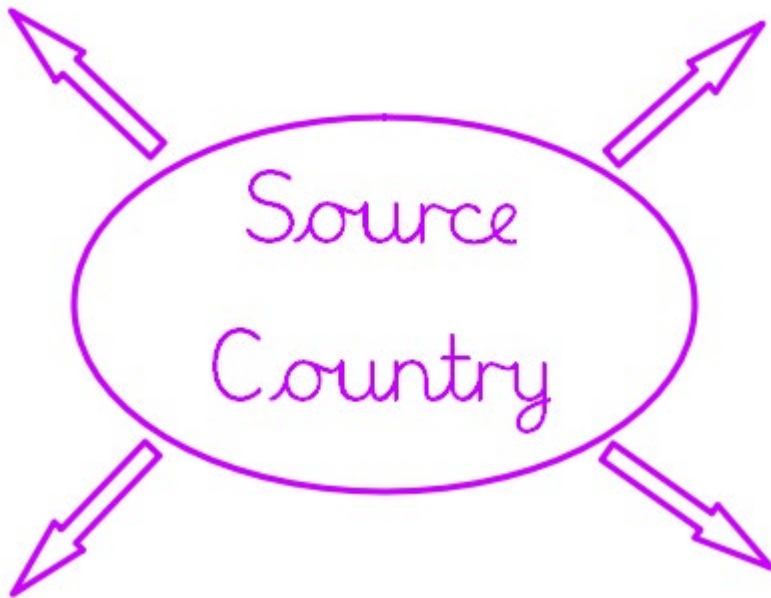
A country which invites other people to stay in it.

Wars

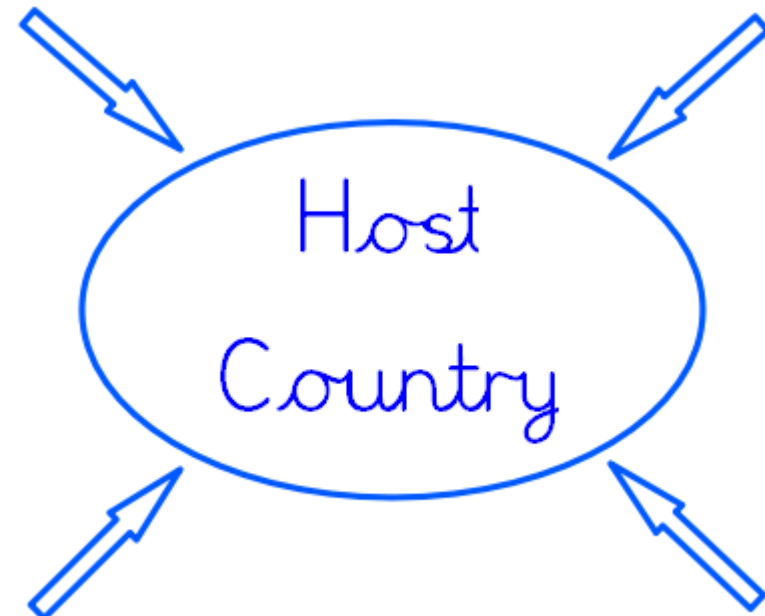


Fewer jobs
