## Goldilocks Maths

Goldilocks is a great story for practicing counting to 3 and also for talking about the size of objects. See if you can sort your toys by order of size, biggest to smallest. Have a look around your house, who has the biggest bed? Who has the smallest shoes?

Maybe you could have a go at writing numerals 1 to 3? When you are going on your walk see if you can spot any numerals 1, 2 or 3 on houses or on any cars you pass.

When you help lay the table talk about how many cups and plates you need. Check you have enough for everyone by counting!

## Sharing the Story

If you know the story of Goldilocks and the Three Bears well maybe you could tell it to your family. You could use some teddy bears and bowls from your kitchen to help make the story even better. I wonder if you can use different voices for each of the characters? How would Baby Bear's voice sound? Maybe you could draw a story map of the story to help you tell it.

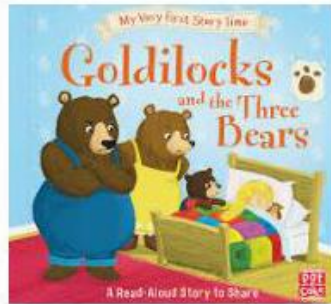
