

Vehicle role play



You could use a box to make a vehicle. It could be a car or a bus or even an aeroplane!

Once you have made your vehicle talk about where you are going to go. Maybe you could draw a map to show where you are going.

You could use chairs or cushions to make a bus for your soft toys. Don't forget to make them some tickets and give them some money to pay! Count how many passengers you have. If one gets off, how many will you have left?

You could make vehicles out of bricks or junk modelling. Milk bottles can make really good wheels! If you make a bus you could draw people or animals in the windows. You could even make a ramp to race your vehicle down. I wonder which vehicle will go down the fastest?

Look carefully out of your window, what different vehicles can you see? What vehicles do you see when you go on your walk? I wonder what colour buses you can see? What number is on the front of the bus? Talk to your grown up about where the bus is going. Talk to your grown up about how to stay safe when you are out on your walk. Maybe you could ride your own vehicle – your scooter or your bike! If it gets muddy maybe you could give it a wash.

After your walk maybe you could think about a vehicle you saw and capture it by drawing, painting or making a vehicle you have seen out of bricks or junk modelling.

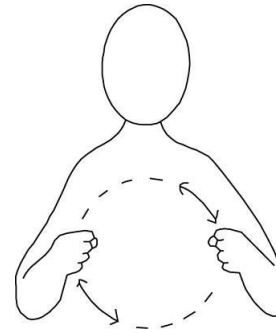

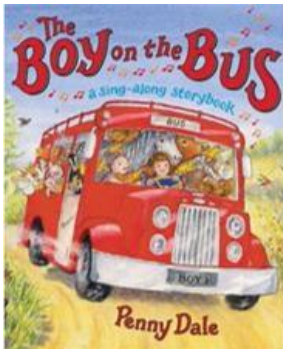
