### Nature Walk

When you go on a walk look carefully at what you can see. What buildings/trees/flowers or animals do you see? If you are at the beach, what can you find?

After your walk maybe you could capture your experience by drawing, painting or making something you have seen out of bricks or junk modelling.

What is the weather like today?

Over a week keep a weather chart by looking outside each day and drawing what the weather is like. Do you like the sun or do you like the rain?

Maybe on a wet day you could jump in some puddles if you have your wellies on!

Can you make a rain catcher and collect some rain?

Maybe you could sing some songs to go with the weather, such as 'The sun has got his hat on' and 'Rain, rain, go away'.

Look at some photographs of your family. Can you talk about similarities and differences between different people? Who is the tallest? Who has the longest hair? Maybe you could take some photos of your family on a camera or phone.

Use cardboard or an old cereal box to make a picture frame. Take it into your garden or on your walk and see what pictures you can make by placing it in different places.
